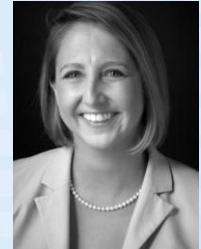

Prior to Adriana's work at DOJ, she was the Head Law Librarian at Xerox Corporation. She was also the manager of the central files and documentation system of Xerox's Office of General Counsel, which had three locations in the United States.
